

I am hardly impartial. I love Silva's books and have read every one. He writes very well and I always

learn something from each book. This may not be his best, but it is worth reading and he ties up all loose ends beautifully. I am a Gabriel Allon fan and I think he is my favorite literary hero in the mystery/intrigue genre. If you have never read an Allon novel, start with an earlier one. The characters become like family and I would prefer you meet them sooner than in this book.

Characters are well developed. A suspenseful drama. A drama that bespeaks of what recent and current events may suggest. Characterization of Russia would seem to be more accurate than not. A very interesting read.

Some Twists but basicly predictable. Partly, because I am reading this novel out of order so know what happens after the climax. A basic problem with a series of books on the same person when read out of order--and even in order their is a lot of duplication of character description. In spite of it, I enjoy the Gabriel Allon Series and hope Daniel Silva will continue to write more. In a larger context, his writting reflects how a number of people in a defined ethnic/religious group of people feel under stress, even mortal survival, and want to give moral justification for committing murderous acts. I would like to know how the new Pope Francis would reaction to Gabriel Allon's need for cultural and personal vengence. I suspect, not as understanding or approving as Silva's fictional pope. It would be very interesting for Gabriel Allon to find a Muslim Iman how would be as understanding and provide moral support for Gabriel's means to maintain Israel's Survival.

Even though Daniel Silva claims that this book is mostly a figment of his imagination, one can imagine that so much of what he portrays would be possible in Russia today. I fear I will be sad when I finish the last Gabriel Allon book!

This is one of the best books that Daniel Silva has written in my opinion. I find all of this book's well written and easy to read but this one was particularly good. There are those that you can't put down and when you get to the end you're sorry it's over. Great book!
