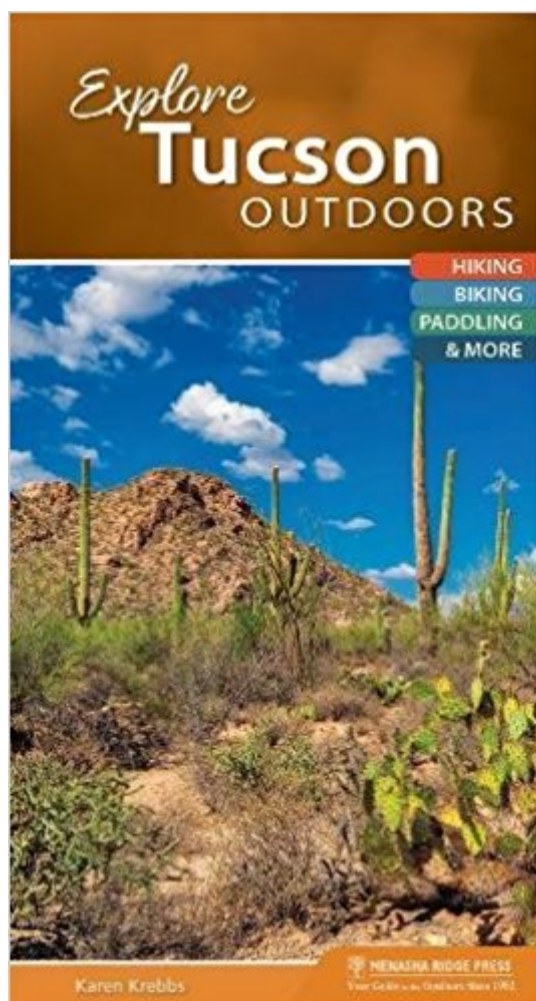

Birding and Nature Trails (Catalina State Park)
Description: A Birding and Nature Trail available at Catalina State Park for birding and nature enthusiasts.
Difficulty: Both trails are fairly easy. There is a brief upward climb at the beginning of the Nature Trail.
Length: Two 1-mile loops for both trails.
Elevation: 2,720 to 2,805 feet
Best Season: September to May; Birding is best early in the morning.
Highlights: Both hikes are pleasant and not strenuous. Interpretive signs line both trails and the views of the Catalina Mountains are spectacular. The trails are appropriate for families and children.
Directions: 32.2532N, 110.5428W; Drive north on Oracle Road (AZ 77) to the entrance of Catalina State Park (about 12 miles north of Grant Road) on the right side of the road. The trails are 2 miles northeast on the paved road and the park entrance. **Additional Information:** The Nature Trail sign is located north of the parking lot. Interpretive signs line the trail, as well as concrete animal footprints of common desert animals. The views include Romero Canyon and the Catalina Mountains to the east and Pusch Ridge and Sutherland Wash to the south. Benches are also available along the trail. At the end of the trail turn east (left) to the Birding Trail. You will cross the Sutherland Wash to the Birding Trail. The trail passes through a mesquite bosque habitat and gradually climbs up railroad ties. Benches and interpretive signs also line this trail and there are views of Pusch Ridge. www.azstateparks.com/parks/cata

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
