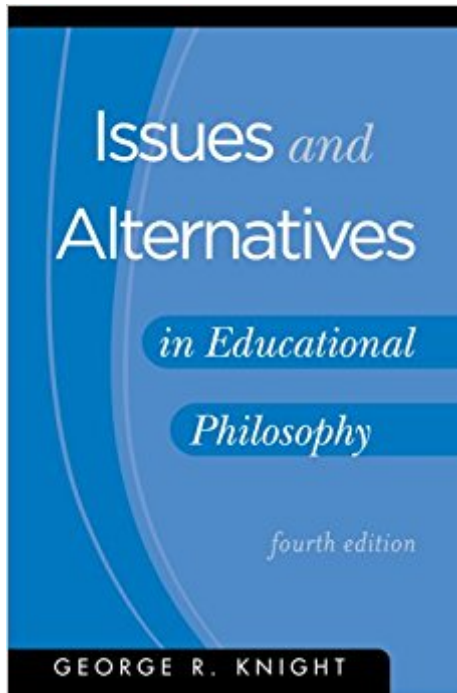




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Issues And Alternatives In Educational Philosophy

There is no lack of medium-sized and larger textbooks on educational philosophy available, but there is a dearth of short introductory texts. In addition, the existing brief treatments generally do not cover the full range of options. *Issues and Alternatives* has been developed to fill that gap.
