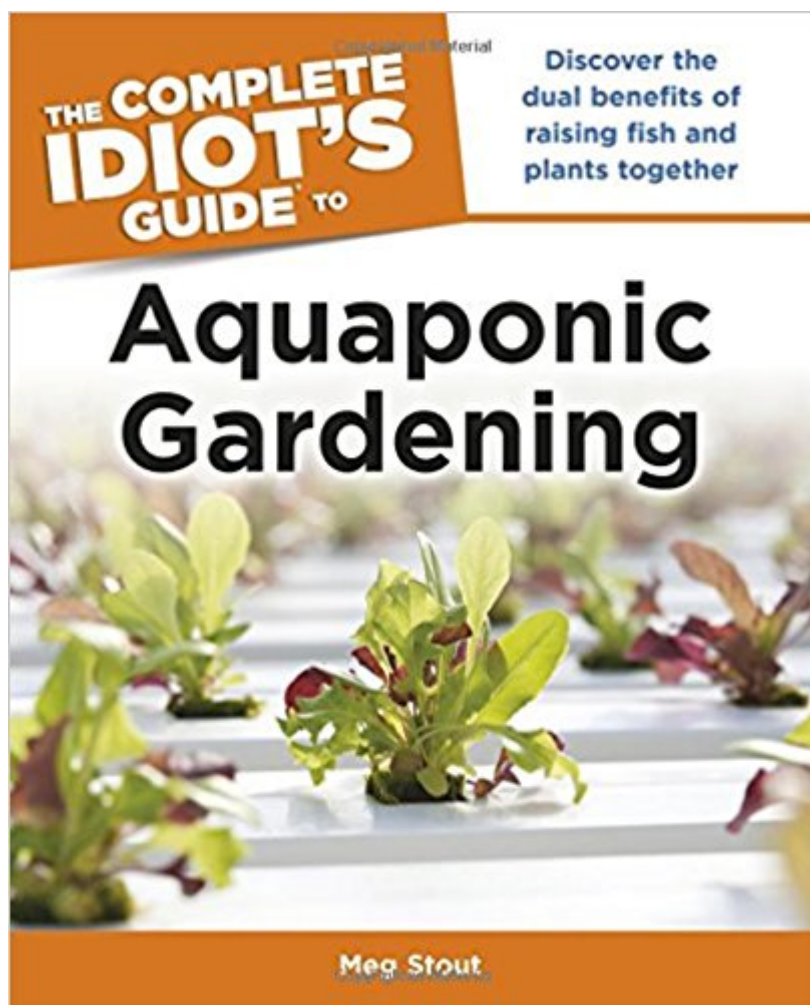


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# The Complete Idiot's Guide To Aquaponic Gardening (Idiot's Guides)

## Customer Reviews

At the outset, I want to acknowledge that this review looks like an outlier given that several people have rated this is a five star book. I am at a loss to explain these reviews except for the possibility that these folks have just begun their aquaponic journeys and simply do not know what they do not know. I had been looking forward to getting this book ever since I read that it was coming out and I finally got my copy. I have already done a fair bit of reading on aquaponics but I am the sort that wants to make sure I know all that I can before I start a new project. So, it is with this idea that I began reading this book. I am sorry to report that I stopped my detailed reading after the third chapter because I just found too many things in the book that contradict what I am now certain are true. For example, on page 9 the author states that you cannot grow cool weather plants and tilapia together. This is certainly false. In fact, Dr. James Rakocy spent most of his thirty year career at the

University of the Virgin Islands developing aquaponics using lettuce and tilapia. Beyond errors, I did not expect to discover that I already know more than what the book offers on key subjects. For example, on page 11 the author covers sump tanks, but does not explain that their primary function is to expand the water capacity in an aquaponics system so that you can go beyond a one to one ratio of fish tank to grow bed volume. In fact, in the first three chapters she seems to be assuming that all systems are restricted to a one to one ratio. This is a big surprise to anyone using the very common CHiFT PiST or CHOP designs that expand all the way up to a three to one ratio. I rapidly read through the short (22 page) Chapter 4 - Fish Tanks, Grow Beds, and Plumbing - and verified that the book entirely avoids any discussion of system types! So I decided to give the book one last chance by flipping to chapter 24 at the end titled "Do It Yourself Systems". If these plans were any good the book would pay for itself. Again I was hugely disappointed. There are two sets of instructions for building extremely basic small systems and, astoundingly, there are ZERO illustrations or images with them! Let me repeat. The entire DIY chapter has no illustrations or images! This led me to review the author chosen to extend the Complete Idiot's Guide series to cover aquaponics. I was a bit surprised at what seems to me to be quite modest credentials for someone writing a book such as this. As best I could tell, she has volunteered to present topics at a couple of small conferences and to volunteer for a new aquaponics association. Maybe there is more, but if so, it is not noted in the book and it does not show in the book's content. In my opinion, there are much better choices for a comprehensive book on home aquaponics. The best of them is Aquaponic Gardening by Sylvia Bernstein.

I read this book cover to cover. It reads well and covers a lot of useful material. Some coverage was pretty superficial and a couple descriptions were pretty confusing (like how to make a bell siphon). My only real complaint had to do with the art program--photos and drawings. I was disappointed by the paucity of drawings and photos to illustrate key concepts and technologies, especially descriptions on how to make certain components. If the book is revised, I'd suggest the publisher pay special attention to this. When the author describes how to build something, show us a photo or drawing of the product so we have a better idea of what we're trying to build.

This is a relatively thorough BASIC guide to Aquaponics but it leaves a lot of questions unanswered. It gives a good explanation of what aquaponics is and why someone would want to participate and good basic explanation of how things work. It then gets rather light on specifics such as all the different options there are for aquaria setups, garden containers, etc. However the greatest shortfall

I found was (as I suspect it is intended to be) it is too general in scope. The issues faced by someone in Minnesota are not the same as someone in the southern coast. The choices of fish are very cursory--one of the significant advantages of aquaponics is the available protein provided by harvesting mature fish as well as vegetables. Lots of space spent on goldfish and koi. And the author really does not address large yard systems which are available widely. If you are looking for a primer as to what aquaponics is and why you would even consider learning more, this is an excellent book and a very inexpensive way to learn about an exciting area. If you are looking for a detailed guide to step-by-step lead you through deciding how big a tank and a plant field, what parts to buy, what fish to raise, how to handle problems of all year tanks when temperatures range from 15 to 100 degrees, this is not sufficiently detailed. Although I have not found that book either.

Wow! I have bought many of their guides in the past; but, this was extremely disappointing!!! Showed different ways of Aquaponics but kept jumping from one to the other way....did not like at all. Plus hardly any pictures or diagrams to follow. NOT a reliable source to learn the subject matter.

This book does a fine job of covering the basics. The author gives detailed DIY instructions and will tell you what to buy and how long to cut it. However, there are no illustrations or pictures to go with the DIY instructions so its difficult to get the big picture of what exactly she is telling you how to make. It's just annoying.

Not a very good book on the subject. Very few illustrations. I found this book mostly useless. I could be an idiot for buying it.

The book is very well written and offers a ton of information. I feel like I have all the knowledge I will need to set my system up next summer. Easy to read, but still includes all the technical information you'll need. There are several places where the author describes how to build a grow bed or greenhouse. But, there are no illustrations. Really could have used illustrations. Of course, with the Internet, quality plans shouldn't be too hard to find.
