

This book is actually a reprint of a book first published in 1918. But the information is still as appropriate for the teachings of the Rosicrucian Order. If you are a person who dislikes ritual but

aspire to wisdom and are not a member of one of the secret societies this is one of the books you should read. It also gives information about Lemuria and Atlantis which is of great interest.

Same material, more or less, of that of The Arcane Teaching but with a much better presentation and organization. I have not finished reading it yet but seems that it left out "The Absolute Law" that is present in the Arcane Teaching. It's like he took the Absolute Law, in his Arcane Teaching, and meshed it with the Infinite Nothingness, of his Arcane Teaching, to get what he calls in the Secret Doctrine of the Rosicrucians as the Eternal Parent. I must say even though The Arcane Teaching and this Secret Doctrine of the Rosicrucians are more or less the same I prefer this book because of it's organization and presentation of the material.

This is his best book. Really goes through the hermetic mystical teachings very well..

If you want to know the truth as to how the Rosicrucians came into beingness, then this book is a must get okay!

From the extended Table of Contents, I was excited to dive into this book. It covers a lot of subjects that I am presently interested in, and while the book is thinner than many on this subject, I was looking for a source that tied all of these things together neatly in less than 1000 pages. I have only read through Part II, less than 1/3 of the book. There was little that was conflicting with what I have already come to know through other cosmologies. Rather, it was the style of the introduction and early chapters that seemed to drag things out without providing much information about the cosmology itself. Apparently, the original book was written by a publisher who didn't want to put his name on the book, so he fabricated the name Magus Incognito (a name which sounds like it came out of a school play or Harry Potter novel). Then the "editor" of this book has chosen to release it, adding a lengthy introduction about the publisher and his pen name. I've been trudging through the Vedas, Steiner, Heindel, Blavatsky... I don't have time or patience for material that isn't revealing something to me paragraph by paragraph like the top-tier doctrines do. I would have to believe that the rest of the book contains some valuable material, and the other reviews indicate the book is worth buying and reading. And as I haven't read the whole book, I'm restraining my rating to 4 stars instead of 3. I would certainly recommend Max Heindel's "The Rosicrucian Cosmo-Conception" or

Blavatsky's "Secret Doctrine" or even "Urantia" as better investments in study material.

A very good thought provoking book. It is very inspiring to read ideas often hidden within our own Western civilization which are only thought of in connection with the East.
