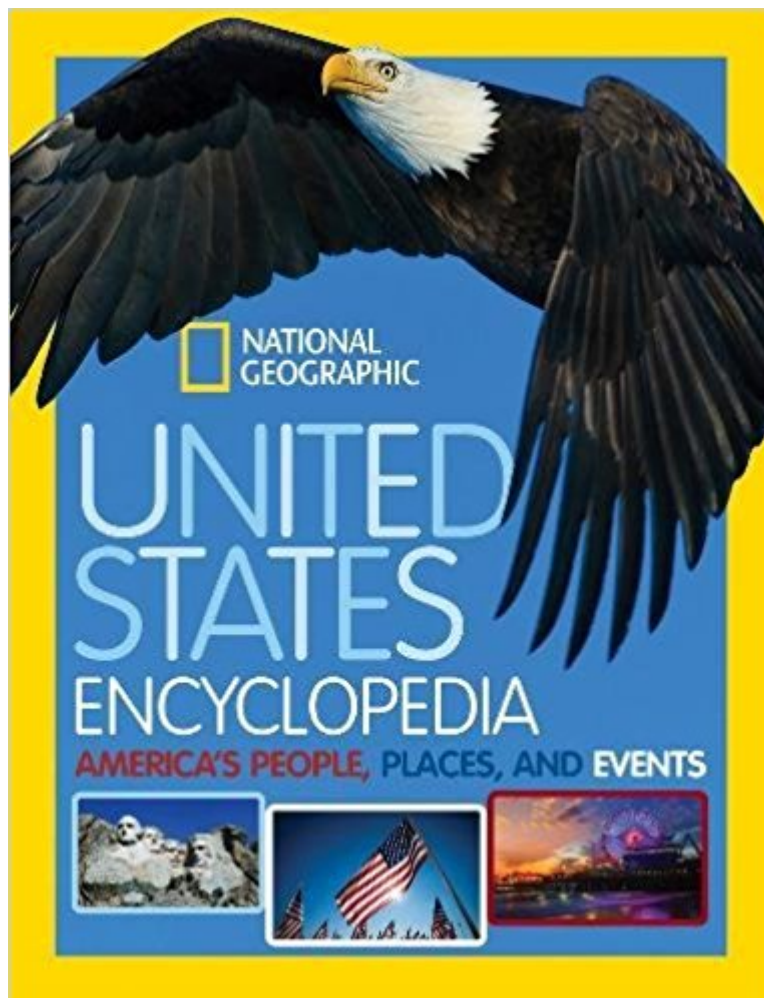

Gr 4 Up—Every inch of this book is expertly executed. In the first section, "Story of a Nation," the author explains in a succession of tidy spreads how the United States was shaped socially, politically, and geographically by major forces, such as the arrival of the English in North America.

Following this foundation building, each state is presented in its own gorgeous four-page chapter. In addition to incorporating the expected material regarding state emblems and population stats, the work includes a concise history for each state, an illustrated time line, and a detailed map. The book is packed with facts, all of which are presented in neatly phrased narratives or in bright, eye-catching sidebars. While much of the material presented is of the report-ready, workaday variety—topography, industry, tourist attractions—some details add narrative sparkle. In keeping with National Geographic tradition, the illustrations in this title are first-rate. The bulk of images are full-color photographs. Archival drawings fill in design gaps. Absolutely stunning production of the 50 United States. This is a hardcover book that is printed on heavy, high-quality gloss paper, so it's a somewhat physically heavy book, but the graphic design and layout along with the written content make it a standout publication. The book is marked "for kids" somewhere, but the book is so well done I would say that anyone of any age could enjoy it. The quality rivals that of what you normally more often see in Europe, where there is a heavy emphasis on printing high-quality magazines and publications. And, for the price, you can't beat it. They probably could have sold this at twice the price. The content is broad, not deep, but that does not matter, because there is so much content to cover that even people who were born and raised in the US will certainly learn some new things from it. Each State of the Union has its own section in the volume, and contains short write-up in the State's history, some key and defining aspects and moments of the State, all adorned with beautiful graphic artwork, photos, illustrations, and textual inserts with additional information. It's the type of book you can read from cover to cover, or pick up and go directly to a specific State and read only that section. Hint: this is GREAT gift. Keep it in mind for "kids," but also for those adult friends who need a birthday or Christmas gift. It will be received well, trust me. An easy five stars.
