

A year ago, her parents divorced; six months ago, her dad and stepmother had a baby; a few weeks ago, her BFF declared their friendship over; and three days ago, her mother tried to commit suicide. Everything in Anna's life feels wrong and awful •and on top of everything else, Anna feels she's let her mother

down. Friend's book deals with all the difficulties of middle school, newly blended families, and—authentically and without oversimplification—having a parent with mental illness. Anna's confusion about her mother, her mother's bipolar disorder, and their relationship are heartbreaking and honest, and her conflicts and conversations with her parents, teachers, and friends ring true. basically the same but this novel is both. Anna is a young girl in high school who has a mom with bipolar two who tried to kill herself. As a result, she is sent to live with her father, stepmother, and their baby. She feels alone, especially since her best friend, Dani, decided to never talk to Anna again when she became popular. I know exactly how this feels and let me tell you: it absolutely sucks. Anna was very relatable. Even if readers have never been through some of the things that she is going through, they will still be able to find a way to relate to her. She is struggling to cope with everything that is going on. She is forced to be friends with the most unpopular girls at school. In the end it turns out that these girls aren't as bad as she thought. This novel is told with such honesty from Anna's point of view that it hurts my heart to think about how heart broken she is over her situation. Even though this novel started out with the tragedy of Anna's mom trying to kill herself, that wasn't the focus. The focus was Anna and the development of her character as she learns a lot about who she is and grows closer with the family she thought she hated. I won't say anything more because I hate spoiling things for people. Everyone should definitely check this novel out. Remember: you're never too old for middle grade novels.

I found this book by browsing the library shelves today and I couldn't be more pleased than with my discovery of this book (and author). 13-year-old Anna's mom tries to kill herself and she moves in with her dad, stepmom and half-sister, and, well, there's a lot to take in. Her best friend stops talking to her just because she's weird (I could so relate to this), and she now sits with the "weird" girls table at lunch. What I loved about this book was how it looked honestly at Bipolar II disorder (which Anna's mom has), blended families, judging others, trichotillomania (which Anna's friend has, and they actually discuss! and don't just write it off), and how friendships can change. There's also no romance/crushing which was really refreshing. Anna's story was full enough. I adored this one - and the cover, too, even though it seems a little more happy than the book inside.

What can I say? I truly enjoyed this book. Where You'll Fine Me follows Anna Collette who moves in with her Dad and his twenty three year old wife and newborn baby after her mother attempts to kill herself. Not only that Anna's best friend Dani dumps for the cool kids after hitting puberty over the summer. With no friends and no one to talk to Anna has no choice but to sit at the "loser" table with a bunch of weird girls. Anna struggles to be happy while constantly worrying over her mom. This book talks about mental disorders and coping with not only the disorder but with life changes. I have to say I loved every character in this book. I wanted Anna to go off on everyone and tell them all

how she really felt. No tried to help her or ask how she was doing or how she felt. I just wanted to hug her through the pages. I loved that she finds friendship with an unlikely bunch of girls with weird quirks, they were super cool by the way. Anna is a smart ass(all in her head of course) and funny as hell.
