

A note from the author — I am so excited to meet you and introduce you to Piper Perish! The character of Piper, an awkward, funny, outspoken emerging artist, came into my life when I least expected her, on New Year's Day 2013, and we've been together ever since. Who knew I would be spending the next few years figuring out what Piper was wearing, debating, and creating on a daily basis? It's been a fun, terrifying, thrilling job to be Piper's author, to guide her through her senior year of high school in Houston and to see what lays ahead for her future post graduation and possibly post-Texas. I am and have always been an avid reader of biographies of great writers and artists. In college, as a drama major, I even created a one-woman theater piece on Tennessee Williams. Writers and artists were and are my creativity teachers. How do they persevere in times of failure and success? How do they have and hold on to relationships? Often biographies focus on the crowning achievements or the very young days and skim over the young adult period, unless something particularly transformative happened during that time. I just wanted to read what was in the mind of a young Picasso or a young Warhol. I wanted to see who they were before the world had an idea of how they should act, who they were and who they should be, what they created. In particular, I wanted to see a young artist living in the now, dealing with her very real, very everyday life problems. Best friends and boyfriends, money and art, a troubled sister and a naive family, wanting to leave home and wanting to stay put. I wanted to read her diary because I wanted to accompany Piper on her unpredictable journey. I wanted to see if she could make it out from under the pressures of being an artist and a teenager at the same time. I wanted to know who Piper would be — and what her art could be — if she was truly free. My biggest heroes have always been and continue to be artists. So, I guess you could say I wanted to write Piper as my up-and-coming superhero. I wanted to give Piper an artist superhero origin story. As a writer who has kept a diary for over 30 years, it was time I wrote and read someone else's entries. I wrote the book I really wanted to read. Hopefully you and your readers will enjoy Piper's journey — and journal — as much as I do. We often see how art is made, but it's not every day we see how artists are made. Thank you for sharing Piper Perish with your young, adventurous, creative readers. My wish is that Piper is a faithful companion who accompanies readers on their own artistic journeys, too. Filled with relatable perspective of teens who have aspirations for greatness, despite others trying to hold them back. Piper is written entirely in a very casual stream-of-consciousness diary style, which did take some getting used to at first, but quickly turned into an absolute delight to read. It reads as exactly the style I like to write ~ no planning, little punctuation and a whole lot of feeling. This format makes it extremely easy to fall into Piper's world and become invested in her messy family situation and her obsession with art, Andy Warhol, and getting the heck out of Texas and to NYC. The art focus is a joy to find in the YA market, as there just aren't that many books to hand to budding artists that this closely speak to the artist's obsessions with creation and design. I can't wait to share this with my high school students! One story line that I became especially interested in was Piper's relationship with her sister, Marli. As you will find in the book, Marli is emotionally volatile and creates much tension for the entire family, as she has her entire life. I connected with this closely as a former special education teacher. In my work with students with emotional behavioral disabilities, many of the families I worked with were at a loss as to how to deal with the emotional turmoil their children exposed their families to. While Marli in this book is not technically labeled with a disorder

or disability, the symptoms remain the same. I was heartbroken for both Piper and her parents as they struggled to absorb MarliÃ¢s wild mood swings. I was also heartbroken for Marli as she (in my opinion) needed professional help for her struggles. This part of the story was woven in throughout the book, and was probably supposed to be a backdrop for the art focus, but I didnÃ¢t read it like that. ThatÃ¢s the joy of books - we can all experience them through our own lens! I will be purchasing a copy of this book for my high school library and another to check out to our high school art classroom. CaganÃ¢s bio on her website states that she will be releasing another novel with Chronicle in 2018 - I canÃ¢t wait! I received a digital review copy of this book in exchange for an honest review.

This book has some breathtakingly beautiful writing, characters who will get under your skin, and a complex but relatable world that will suck you in and make it impossible for you put the novel down. Piper is so real to me and you will root for her from the first page. I'd highly recommend this for teens that love the arts, teens who are motivated or inspired, and for anyone who really wants a brilliant read. Adults will enjoy this just as much as young adults (speaking as a not-so-young adult).
