

This was a cute and sweet read. Amber Johnson has been living in New York City with her Columbia University Professor mother and Mystery Author father. She has been homeschooled. She decides she wants to go to a normal school and be normal for a change so her parents uproot all of them and they move to a small town in Washington state. She moves next door to Marla and Jason Turner and their parents. Jason and his best friends Tank, Nick, and Luke are popular and great looking guys. Jason's great looking, the Star Quarterback, and women just flock to him. Amber's quite intelligent and her parents have had her on a trajectory to go to college at Harvard. She's already been offered to get in but her parents want her to wait since she's still pretty naive. She was hoping that she could just go to a school in NYC but her parents want her to

experience other things and places. She's instantly attracted and interested in Jason but she's not want to fall all over herself for a guy or anyone. She thinks Jason is crazy for wanting to have a "fake" relationship. Jason's so busy and has decided he doesn't want to date his senior year of high school. He's got school, football practice, and sometimes working for his father so he doesn't have much time for anything else. The school's 3 Queen Bee's Cindy, Sheryl, and Julie all want Jason to choose them to go out with and they think it's their right. From the first time he lays eyes on Amber, he's attracted and interested but doesn't want the complications. So he comes up with an idea for Amber to be his "fake" girlfriend which will get all the other girls to leave him alone. He didn't expect to actually care about her and for her to be stuck in his head. Worth reading.

This sort of fluffy, predictable, teen romance has its place even though most of them will ever be considered great literature. But this was sloppier and more bland than most. The characters, setting, and plot were just so completely blank. None of them have any defining traits or are explored in any way - it's all about the utterly predictable and family-friendly plot which barrels down the track to the obvious conclusion. The main characters really have no reason to be together other than thinking the other person is "hot" (probably because they don't really have defined personalities, interests, or conflicts). Plus the whole book was slapped together so fast that there are actually feedback notes left the text - somebody gave feedback about consistent terminology yet ignored the bad grammar, sentence fragments, and questionable understanding of how punctuation works. (Commas are not confetti - you don't sprinkle them everywhere just to make things more fun. Also, sentences that are questions normally end in this symbol: '?') Alas, I grabbed the whole 3-book series for a plane trip and I can say that things get a little better in the later books, but all of them are still at the quality level of "it passed spell-check, must be great!" If you are a pre-teen girl with low standards, I guess this will keep you vaguely entertained for an hour or two.
