

Every story in this book is a pleasure to read. These once-famous crimes have truly been forgotten. The author has done extensive research to bring these stories to print, and I appreciate his efforts to do so. Each story is complete based on the information available and includes photos where available. I wish I could give it a five-star rating. However, if I had proofread this book, I would have corrected at least 36 errors. In addition, many times hyphenation was inexplicably and incorrectly used while at other times, there was no hyphenation where it was needed. Regardless, I eagerly look forward to any new release by this author.

Eight different stories of obscure crimes of the past with just enough detail to be interesting but not so much to be tedious. If you like true crime and are tired of the old favorites that are dished up over and over give this one a chance. I enjoyed it and never heard of these cases before. Includes photos and footnotes.

I am a huge fan of true crime stories. The books that I read all talk about the same crimes (black dahlia, dahmer, gein, manson, jack the ripper, etc). Its refreshing to find a book about lesser known true crimes. I highly recommend this for any true crime fan!

The real appeal of this book is its novelty. Famous murders have generally come to mean one of about 50 cases with a lengthy print history and so easier to research. Jack the Ripper a great example. But these lesser known cases were in their own way just as appealing and their appeal is because they are new to the reader. The author does make the point he does not consider length of the story an issue but the book could have done with some editing. As a read though first class,
