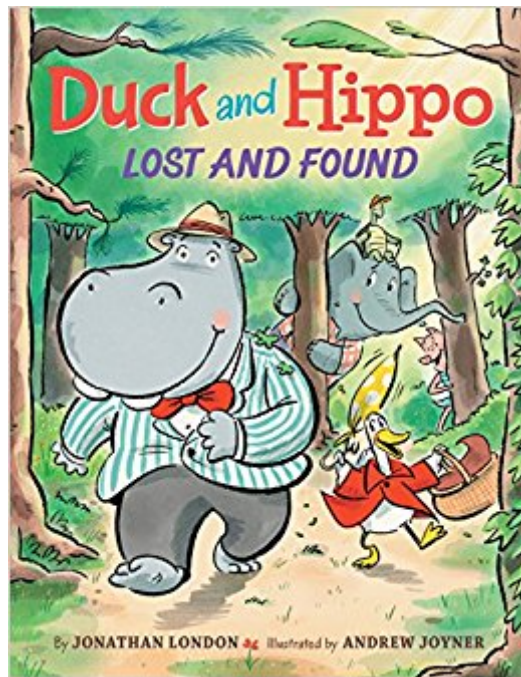

I am thrilled to introduce you to another adventure with Duck and Hippo. The first book, DUCK AND HIPPO IN THE RAINSTORM was a delightful story of an unlikely friendship and I’ve been anxiously waiting for the new adventure to arrive. Hippo and Duck are the best of friends even though they may not be the most likely pair. They want to celebrate the end of summer and decide to have a picnic with all of their friends. Everyone arrives at the pond with their favorite goodies and just when

they are about to eat, Hippo realizes he forgot to bring food to share. Not willing to partake without contributing, he sets off to find some berries in the woods. Unfortunately, as the title suggests, Hippo gets lost...or does he? It's another silly adventure with Duck, Hippo, and their friends that your child will get a kick out of reading. I adore the colors, the expressions, and the large letters to help children identify the words to read on the pages. Elephant's surprised face or Hippo's joyful "Hello" is sure to engage the kids and get them excited to read the story along with their parents. I also appreciated how all of Hippo's friends wanted to wait to eat until he got back and then still put off their eating to go and find Hippo. The party wasn't going to happen without Hippo and teaches children about enduring friendships as well as manners. I think these characters could get into lots of silly adventures and keep your children interested for years to come!

"Duck and Hippo Lost and Found" takes up the notion of the end of summer, and sends it out with a bash. Duck and friends decide to have a picnic, but Hippo forgets to bring something, and feels sorry. The friends get separated and lost at night in the woods, where Hippo is looking for the last berries of summer. They are reunited and have an evening picnic, with some dancing, fun, and good food. The illustrations are cute, the animal characters are colorful, and the story captivated my four-year-old, who enjoys books like the Henry and Mudge stories about a boy and a dog, or the Elephant and Piggie books from Mo Willems. Another promising entry in a fun series.

My 4 & 10 year old children enjoyed the next story with Duck and Hippo. The story is just as entertaining as the 1st one. It is requested each night by the 4 year old. Keep up the good work!
