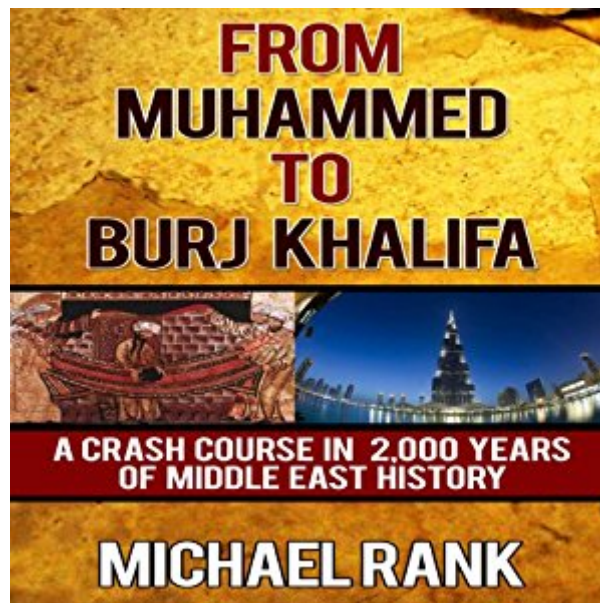

This is a perfect introduction to the highly complex issue of the middle east conflict. I didn't get lost on a tangle of unnecessary names and events. If you want a basic understanding of the issue with heavy splash of wry humor, it's the best there is.

This book is exactly as described: short, concise, and covers all the ground you need in order to have a solid but basic knowledge of the Middle East. It has whet my appetite to read something more detailed on this topic. My only two minor quibbles was that I found the book to be written at times from a really obviously American perspective (including a (brief) reference to Halliburton), where I would have preferred a more wholly neutral voice. I also found the "Here's why this matters to you" sentence at the start of each chapter to be unnecessary. Otherwise, a well composed, informative tome.

This book provides a well written summary of Middle East. If you don't have time to get into great detail on this subject, this is the book for you. Although I understand the author's reasoning on why he took the point the position he did on the six-day war, I found the chapter to be misleading on what actually happened. The author attributes the success of the six-day war to the excellent training of the Jewish war machine. However, this is not what happened and you don't have to spend a great deal of time in research to figure this out. The truth is the Jews were vastly outnumbered and surrounded expecting to be slaughtered. The Arab armies were closing in for the final kill when suddenly for no apparent reason, the Arab army went into a frenzy and started firing at each other. Then in a bizarre turn of events, turned and fled. U.S. support eventually arrived for assistance but not before an incredible miracle had taken place. This story is well documented and the Arabs will testify they saw a huge army of Israel troops headed for them which they claim is the reason they fled. You cannot tell the story of Jews and neglect the miraculous but in all fairness to the author and today's cynical media, I completely understand the position taken. Hopefully you (the reader) will take the next challenge and dig a little deeper than just the surface understanding of these events. Good book and good read. This is a good, short primer to the history of the Middle East. However, the editing of the Kindle version is awful. Most of the chapter names are missing from the main table of contents; but it includes a bunch of links to advertisements for other books. Also, the links on the secondary table of content in the text itself don't work at all. How can publishers be so irresponsible as to release such sloppy work, I fail to understand.

Good Basic Overview Of Critical Political Movement. For one just beginning to study The Muslim movement, this book will provide a helpful frame work for understanding of how the movement went from an almost purely religious movement with positive views/ relationships with Christians and Jews to an essentially political movement wrapped in a veneer of religion with a firm doctrine go hatred for Christians/Jews and any others who do not adhere to the Muslim "faith/politic". Rated it a three primarily because of the very basic non-nuanced explanations. Hard to provide a basic frame work while explaining fully the events/actions which so dramatically changed the teachings of this formerly religious movement.
